

Historical Performances of Indian Athletes in the Asian Games

The Asian Games 2022 concluded in Hangzhou, China between 23rd September 2023 to 08th October 2023. For the first time, India created history since the inception of the Asian Games in 1951 by winning a total of 107 medals, the country's highest ever so far, and secured fourth position in the final tally. It is an exponential increase in the number of medals along with securing gold medals in different categories.



The implementation of the revised scheme will boost the technical, sports, and coaching skills along with the educational and mental ability aspects for achieving quality and excellence in the international sports arena. **The MYAS will be the governing body** to see the overall progress over time.

Objectives of the Revised Scheme

Providing financial support for short-term (3-6 months) specialized courses and long-term courses (max. 2 years) in specific field of sports like Anthropometry, Anti Doping, Biomechanics, Exercise Physiology, General theory & method of training (GTMT), Kinesiology, Sports Psychology, Sports Medicine and Sports Nutrition.

Promoting participation by professionals in Seminars, Conferences, training and Workshops in India or abroad for the interchange of knowledge, skills and ideas backed up by financial aid.

Inviting qualified and successful experts from the foreign soil such as professors, coaches, sports scientists, directors, sports medicine professionals, technical officials, scholars, masseurs and physiotherapists to India for mentorship, guidance, education, training and consultation among others.

Upgrading professional skills of different sports personalities like coaches, match officials and others in their respective field by introducing courses and training modules along with qualifying examinations.

Supporting research projects and its setup as required aided by financial support.

Financial aid for publication and sponsoring of sports and games related quality content and literature on public platform.

Preparing digital course content for learning games technique and knowledge in different native languages and circulated among local coaches and public.

Boosting sports development with the help of cutting-edge technology and promoting start-ups to popularize sports in the society supported by financial assistance.

The revised scheme is divided into five modules for its smooth and systematic execution and the overall development of sports in the country. The approximate expenses for this scheme will be around INR 45,000 crores for financial years 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26, assuring India to join hands with the existing sports country of the world.

Five Modules of the Revised Scheme for HRDS

Conducting Seminars, Training Programmes, Conferences and Workshops in the country & attending conferences, seminars and workshops of famous sports person in India and outside. Promoting interchange of ideas, knowledge and research.

KIUG Games History

First edition took place in Odisha in 2020.

Second edition took place in Bangalore in 2022, postponed by one year because of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The KIUG 2023 event witnessed the participation of around 4750 athletes from

over 200 universities/institutions, there were a total of twenty-one sports categories in which the athletes competed with each other.

Target Olympic Podium Scheme to Add Premium Assistance to India's Top Athletes


The Target Olympic Podium (TOP) Scheme was launched by the Ministry of Youth Affairs and Sports (MYAS) in September 2014 to provide top-level premium assistance to the finest athletes of India to win Olympic medals. Earlier the aim was to win medals in the Rio 2016 and Tokyo 2020 Olympics. But now it will continuously look forward to the Paris Olympics 2024, Milan-Cortina d'Ampezzo Olympics 2026, Los Angeles Olympics 2028, and Brisbane Olympics 2032.

The TOP scheme focuses on searching right kind of athletes who can be trained with premium assistance and become eligible assets for winning medals in the Olympic and Paralympic games. **The selection procedure has been governed by the ministry's TOPS Elite Athlete's Identification Committee**. The MYAS is accountable for electing the TOP scheme members which focus on high-priority sports.

High Priority Sports List



The ministry has created a unique department called Mission Olympic Cell (MOC), headed by the Director General (DG) of the Sports Authority of India (SAI) whose motive is to assist athletes selected under the TOP scheme.

MOC Functions List

Approve financial aid for personalized programs

Systematic reporting system for athletes training program Planned communication to highlight needs, progress and feedbacks from athletes

Compliance system to cross check ad-hoc obligations and documents for recipient

Deciding authority against unpredicted proposal of the athletes for their needs or request

Outsourcing few or all jobs to third party for doing it

Recommend top-class programs for selected athletes under TOP scheme

Overall progress check of athletes as per the training module to evaluate, monitor and assist them Meeting demands of commercials, sponsors and media for NSDF funds of TOP scheme

The scheme broadly focuses on boosting athletes' training skills covered in their Annual Calendar of Training and Competition (ACTC) where they can place requests for different assistance available under this scheme.

Monthly stipend of INR 50,000 for each TOP scheme athlete

Getting top-notch tailored guidance from reputed coaches/trainers

Becoming part of international events by participating in it

Buying of sports equipment's

Additional assistance tailored for respective sport category

Seamless interface with assisting staff like physical trainers, mental trainers, sports psychologist and physiotherapists

Recently, the MYAS has included medal winners, archer Atanu Das, rifle shooter Mehuli Ghosh, and Tilottama Sen again in the TOP scheme among others. After all, athletes nominated under this scheme have brought medals in the past Olympics and Commonwealth Games and thus proved the efficacy of the scheme.

The National Sports Development Fund (NSDF) has allocated 54.40% of it towards the Target Olympic Podium scheme

TOP scheme core and development group reabsorbed few medal winners from past and added twenty-seven new athletes making total count to 270 in which 101 belongs to core and 269 in development group

The TOP scheme plays a vital role in benefiting athletes on financial grounds and boosting their holistic development by encouraging them through quality exposure complemented by training programs for learning the best techniques. Continuous efforts under this scheme make India proud and shine on the international sports podium during the medal ceremony with the melodious tone of 'Jana Gana Mana'.
