




India Reasserted Its Global Commitment to Sustainable Agriculture at the 15th BRICS Meet in Brazil


The 15th meeting of the BRICS Agriculture Ministers was conducted in Brasília, Brazil, on April 17, 2025. Its theme was "Promoting Inclusive and Sustainable Agriculture through Cooperation, Innovation, and Equitable Trade among BRICS Countries," under this theme, India reaffirmed its steadfast commitment to promoting sustainable and inclusive agriculture. The Indian delegation emphasized the critical importance of supporting small and marginal farmers, who constitute a significant share of the global agricultural workforce, and are central to achieving food security and rural development.



India advocated for comprehensive strategies including cluster-based farming, strengthening FPOs, promoting natural farming, and various other cooperative models to empower small farmers. These initiatives aim to improve market access, boost income, and ensure equitable growth across agricultural sectors.

In the face of increasing global price volatility, India also stressed the need for fair and transparent agricultural trade systems. It called for policies including public food stockholding, minimum support prices (MSP), and value chains that connect producers directly with consumers. India's ability to distribute free food rations to over 800 million citizens during the COVID-19 pandemic was also highlighted as a successful example of efficient agricultural governance and food security.





India showcased its digital advancements in agriculture, including the Digital Agriculture Mission and AgriStack, alongside the deployment of drones to modernize farming practices. Programs like Lakhpati Didi and Drone Didi were introduced as part of India's efforts to empower rural women economically and socially, aligning with broader goals of gender inclusion in agriculture.

COLLABORATION FOR COMBATING CLIMATE CHANGE THROUGH PROGRAMS



The meeting also marked the launch of the "BRICS Land Restoration Partnership," aimed at combating land degradation and restoring soil health. India endorsed the initiative, emphasizing its potential to benefit small farmers and marginalized communities.



In addition to multilateral discussions, India explored bilateral cooperation with Brazil in agriculture and agritech. This meeting has given India a chance to showcase its Vedic values and environmental stewardship on the global stage while reiterating its unfailing commitment to sustainable agriculture.



FUTURE OF INNOVATION: ALIGNING TECHNOLOGIES WITH TOMORROW'S ECONOMY

India is strategically aligning its technological advancements with the evolving demands of tomorrow's economy, emphasizing innovation to drive sustainable growth and global competitiveness. A cornerstone of this vision is the substantial investment in emerging technologies. The Union Budget 2025 earmarked Rs 2,000 crore for the IndiaAl Mission, a significant increase from the previous year's allocation.

This initiative aims to bolster AI research, develop sector-specific applications in healthcare, agriculture, and education, and establish AI Centres of Excellence in premier institutions. Complementing this, the establishment of the IndiaAI Safety Institute underscores the government's commitment to ethical AI deployment, ensuring technologies are developed with safety and inclusivity.





Further, the National Quantum Mission, backed by an allocation of Rs 6,003.65 crore, is strategically advancing India's position in quantum research. With a deep focus on developing cutting-edge capabilities in quantum computing, communication, and sensing, India is establishing global technological leadership in the field. To nurture a robust innovation ecosystem, the government has introduced several initiatives.

The Anusandhan National Research Foundation Act 2023 seeks to streamline research across disciplines, promoting collaboration between academia, industry, and government agencies. Additionally, the Atal Innovation Mission continues to inspire young minds, with plans to establish 50,000 Atal Tinkering Labs in schools nationwide, fostering a culture of creativity and problem-solving from an early age. The government has strengthened its support frameworks, acknowledging the critical role of startups in fostering innovation.



SHAPING INDIA THROUGH TECHNOLOGY-DRIVEN INNOVATION



The Fund of Funds for Startups has been bolstered with an additional Rs 10,000 crore, focussing on deep-tech ventures. Moreover, tax incentives have been extended to startups incorporated before April 1, 2030, offering a three-year tax holiday and exemptions on capital gains, thereby encouraging entrepreneurship and investment in cutting-edge technologies. Through these efforts, India is fostering technological innovation and ensuring that such advancements are inclusive, ethical, and aligned with the broader socio-economic objectives.



CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS ON THE INDUS WATER TREATY

Between 2023-2025, the IWT underwent notable developments. India formally notified its intent to review and amend the treaty under Article XII(3), time and again in January 2023 and August 2024. It was done citing major and unforeseen shifts, including population growth, environmental challenges, and the demand for clean energy.

Review, modify Indus Waters Treaty, India tells Pak, looks to renegotiate

SIXTY-FOUR years after the two countries signed the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) in Karachi on September 19, 1960, India has served formal notice to Pakistan seeking "review and modification" of the treaty, signalling serious political intent in Delhi to end it.

This notice is qualitatively different and a step higher than



India is building the Kishanganga (above) and Ratle power projects in Jammu and Kashmir. NHPC India's notice to Pakistan in January 2023 for the "modification" of the treaty. This time, it is seeking "review and modification" — an escalation that essentially underlines the intention to revoke the treaty and renegotiate it.

Sources said Wednesday that India served formal notice to Pakistan on August 30, seeking review and modification of the IWT under Article XII (3) of the pact. Under Article XII (3) of the

Disputes have arisen over India's construction of the Kishanganga (330 MW) and Ratle (850 MW) hydroelectric projects on the Jhelum and Chenab rivers, respectively. In January 2025, the Neutral Expert (appointed by the World Bank) affirmed his competence to adjudicate these disputes, supporting India's stance to exclude the Permanent Court of Arbitration (PCA) from the process.

Dispute Key to India's IWT Stance

Dispute over two projects – 330 MW Kishanganga hydro project and under-construction Ratle project in Chenab valley

Neutral expert was examining points of differences

on issues like pondage, intake for turbines, design of outlets below dead storage level and gated spillways at these projects



Claiming violation of IWT norms, Pakistan moved a concurrent Court of Arbitration proceeding against India in 2016, linking Ratle later to the dispute that originally centred on Kishanganga India objected to concurrent proceedings and did not attend the arbitration meetings

In response to escalating tensions, India suspended the IWT on April 23, 2025, following a terrorist attack in Pahalgam, Kashmir. Following this, India stopped the flow of water from the Baglihar Dam (on the Chenab River) and planned similar actions at the Kishanganga Dam (on the Neelum River). These measures, carried out without prior notification to Pakistan, marked a significant shift in the region's water-sharing dynamics.



The World Bank, while facilitating the appointment of the Neutral Expert, has maintained a limited role, emphasizing that it cannot interpret the treaty. The developments underscore the complexities of the IWT in the context of evolving geopolitical and environmental challenges.



Forest Finance: World is Transforming Existing Funding Mechanism to Close the Gap

Forests are a great source for regulating climate, biodiversity, and livelihoods. To protect them Forest finance is a concept that talks about investing in the planet's health, resilient economies, and a sustainable future besides protecting trees. However, a significant financing gap continues to hinder conservation efforts. To address this, global stakeholders are transforming traditional funding models by embracing mechanisms that blend public, philanthropic, and private capital. This shift reflects growing recognition that forest preservation is not just an environmental priority, but a smart investment in global stability and economic resilience.



One major initiative is the **Mobilising Finance for Forests (MFF) program**, launched by the UK government and the Dutch entrepreneurial development bank. **It focuses on putting 850 million pounds in private investments to conserve tropical forests in Africa, Asia, and Latin America**. In April 2024, the World Bank introduced new financial tools to expand development lending, including forest-related projects backed by 11 countries.

The Global Environment Facility (GEF), a key source of multilateral biodiversity funding, received \$5.33 billion in pledges for its 2022–2026 cycle, reinforcing global commitment to ecological priorities. Still, imbalances persist. A 2025 report found that for every \$1 spent on forest protection, \$6 supports deforestation drivers such as industrial agriculture and logging. This highlights the urgency of redirecting financial flows toward sustainable land use.

In India also, forest finance is gaining traction. In March 2023, the Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) committed INR 520 crore to a project in West Bengal to enhance biodiversity, resilience, and livelihoods. The World Bank, in November 2024, approved a forest revitalization project for Tripura and Nagaland, to provide employment opportunities to over 60,000 individuals and support forest-based entrepreneurship. These efforts reflect a shift in India's approach toward integrating forest health with local development and climate action.

To close remaining gaps, the **United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)** is also helping countries access **REDD+ financing**, diversify funding, and strengthen technical capacity for forest management. Regional collaboration and transparency are emphasized to ensure inclusive outcomes. Transformation in forest finance is underway and sustained collaboration, fair resource allocation, and innovation will help to scale up and safeguard forest conservation for future generations.

India Celebrating Startup-led Economic Growth at Satrup Mahakumbh 2025

State of India's Environment 2025 Presents Comprehensive Analysis

The Centre for Science and Environment (CSE) and Down To Earth magazine, offer in-depth insights into the nation's environmental challenges in the "State of India's Environment 2025" report, with a particular focus on climate change and waste management. The report highlighted that 2024 was the warmest year on record, underscoring the accelerating pace of global warming. In 2019, chemical pollution was linked to two million deaths and 53 million disability-adjusted life years globally, according to World Health Organization data cited in the report.

The transformation of India's waste management landscape with efforts to promote circularity and sustainable practices is also reflected in this comprehensive document. The report showcases various initiatives aimed at improving solid waste management under the Swachh Bharat Mission 2.0.

The report noted the persistent challenges like policies have been formulated to address waste management, their implementation often falls short due to inadequate infrastructure and public awareness. To bridge this gap, it advocates for community participation, robust policy enforcement, and investment in waste management technologies.




