O1 PACKAGED FOOD SECTOR COMMITS TO TRANSFERRING GST REFORM GAINS TO CONSUMERS



India's packaged food sector has pledged to pass on the benefits of recent GST reforms directly to consumers. The commitment was made during a high-level roundtable jointly organized by the Ministry of Food Processing Industries and the Confederation of Indian Industry, where leading companies assured the government of their readiness to ensure the reform translates into lower prices for consumers and greater affordability for households.

The revised GST structure has been simplified into two primary slabs of 5 and 18 percent. Many everyday packaged staples, dairy products, snacks, and bakery items have been moved to lower tax brackets or exempted entirely. This rationalization aims to reduce the burden on consumers while promoting ease of doing business within the sector. The industry's unified response signals its willingness to ensure that the benefits of tax savings are reflected in product pricing across shelves nationwide and contribute to strong market competition and price stability.

Executives from major companies such as Amul, Britannia, ITC, Dabur, PepsiCo, Coca-Cola, Mondelez, and Bisleri pledged to maintain transparency and share the tax relief throughout the value chain. Their commitment extends beyond consumers to supporting farmers, MSMEs, and distributors, ensuring equitable benefit distribution and strengthening the broader food processing ecosystem that sustains millions of rural and urban livelihoods.

The government has also announced steps to ease compliance and ensure smooth transition. Companies may continue using old packaging printed before the GST revision until March 2026, provided new price stickers are added without concealing the original MRP. The requirement to publish revised prices in newspapers has been replaced with the need to circulate updated price lists among wholesalers and retailers, reducing procedural delays and improving overall efficiency.

While the sector's pledge marks a strong step toward consumer welfare, its effectiveness will depend on ground-level execution. Regular monitoring, retailer cooperation, and transparent pricing practices will ultimately determine how effectively GST reform gains reach Indian households and reinforce public confidence in the reform process.



WORLD FOOD INDIA 2025 TO SHOWCASE INDIA AS THE "GLOBAL FOOD HUB"



World Food India 2025 positioned India at the forefront of the global food landscape, showcasing its capabilities as a true Global Food Hub in processing, exports, and innovation. Held from September 25 to 28 at Bharat Mandapam, New Delhi, the event brought together global investors, policymakers, and industry leaders, demonstrating India's potential to be a central hub for the world's food supply chain and emerging technologies in food processing.

The summit emphasized India's attractiveness for investment in food processing. **Twenty-six domestic and international companies signed Memoranda of Understanding** (MoU) worth Rs1,02,046.89 crore, marking a historic commitment to strengthen India's global

food ecosystem. These investments are expected to create **over 64,000 direct jobs and more than 10 lakh indirect employment opportunities**, further cementing India's position as a hub for production, processing, distribution, and high-value food exports.

DIVERSE INVESTED SEGMENTS



World Food India 2025 facilitated extensive global collaboration. Over 10,500 B2B meetings, 261 G2G sessions, and more than 18,000 reverse buyer-seller interactions connected stakeholders from over 90 countries. Forty technical sessions on sustainability, plant-based foods, nutraceuticals, food safety, and climate-smart supply chains further reinforced India's emergence as a technologically advanced and sustainable global food hub, capable of meeting growing international demand.



Government support highlighted India's readiness to lead globally. The Prime Minister announced a reduction in GST on biodegradable packaging from 18% to 5% and released Rs 2,518 crore in credit-linked subsidies under the Pradhan Mantri Formalization of Micro Food Processing Enterprises (PMFME) Scheme, benefiting 26,000 micro food enterprises. These measures strengthen India's competitiveness, supply chain capacity, and innovative ecosystem, ensuring the country's hub status is backed by robust policy frameworks.



The collaboration, **formalized during World Food India 2025**, underscores a growing public–private alignment to strengthen India's agri-food processing sector and promote innovation-driven rural growth. It also reflects a shared intent to enhance competitiveness in India's fast-evolving manufacturing and value-chain landscape.

Under the MoU, Godrej Agrovet plans to expand its manufacturing and processing footprint, focusing on the company's oil palm and pet food businesses. The investment will enhance research, innovation, and value-added processing capabilities. The company aims to establish new production units and R&D facilities that will improve efficiency and promote sustainable farming practices. It also plans to explore new product lines catering to both domestic and export markets, with a focus on quality and traceability.

STATES UNDER NON-BINDING MOU



According to the company's management, the partnership reflects its long-term commitment to India's agricultural transformation. By investing in modern processing infrastructure, Godrej Agrovet seeks to boost value creation across the **farm-to-fork chain** and strengthen its position in high-growth segments. The company also emphasized its focus on **leveraging technology and innovation** to ensure inclusivity, sustainability, and better income opportunities for farmers.

From the government's perspective, MoFPI views this collaboration as an important step toward attracting private sector participation in food processing and rural development. The Ministry's Secretary, Avinash Joshi, described the MoU as a reaffirmation of shared goals to build a robust agri-food ecosystem, enhance value addition, and improve rural livelihoods through


FOOD SECURITY IN INDIA STRENGTHENED BY RECORD AGRICULTURAL OUTPUT AND BETTER STORAGE



India's food security has gained fresh momentum in 2025, propelled by a historic harvest and parallel strides in storage infrastructure. The government's Third Advance Estimates report a record foodgrain output of 353.96 million tonnes in 2024-25, including 117.51 million tonnes of wheat and 149.07 million tonnes of rice. This surge reflects improved agronomic practices, favourable weather, and supportive policy measures.

However, production alone cannot guarantee food security unless matched by efficient post-harvest management and storage. Recognizing this, India has significantly expanded its storage footprint. As of mid-2025, the Food Corporation of India (FCI) and state agencies jointly maintain a combined covered plus "cover and plinth" storage capacity of 917.83 lakh metric tonnes. In parallel, cold storage facilities—critical for perishable produce—number 8,815 units with a capacity of 40.21 million tonnes, helping preserve quality, prevent spoilage, and improve distribution efficiency.

To deepen reach, **decentralized storage is being scaled up through Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS)**. By June 2025, 5,937 new PACS had been registered, and 73,492 existing ones had been computerized, enhancing transparency, rural access, and facilitating smoother grain management across districts. Storage modernization is also underway: steel silos under public–private partnerships are being commissioned, and tenders for additional silo capacity are in the pipeline.

Various government interventions are supporting this infrastructure expansion, offering **financial assistance and incentives for building warehouses, cold chains, processing units, and advanced storage systems** across the country, including rural and remote areas, to strengthen food supply networks. Under these initiatives, over Rs 66,310 crore has been sanctioned for more than 1.13 lakh projects as of June 2025, further boosting storage capacity and farmer participation.

BIHAR SET TO DRIVE INDIA'S EMERGENCE AS A GLOBAL FOOD BASKET





In May 2025, the International Buyer-Seller Meet (IBSM) held in Patna marked a major milestone in this direction, attracting over 70 international buyers from 20 countries. More than 400 business engagements took place, connecting farmer producer organizations, MSMEs, and food processors with international markets. The event strengthened Bihar's position as a promising hub for agri-based exports and showcased its growing capacity to meet global demand for high-quality produce.



To strengthen this momentum, the state government and central ministries are aligning initiatives that enhance food processing and exports. Under the PMFME scheme, Bihar has emerged as the top-performing state, with over 10,000 loans worth Rs 620 crore sanctioned for micro food enterprises in 2024–25. A report, titled "Strategies to Boost India's Makhana Exports," to boost India's makhana exports further underlines the state's commitment to globalizing its niche agri-products.

Infrastructure development is also gathering pace. The Mega Food Park at Muzaffarpur, approved by the Government of India, is set to become a hub for value-added processing and export readiness. In addition, Bihar has simplified investment procedures through a single-window system ensuring land allotments within seven days, making the state more attractive for agri-investors.
